Networking Special Interest Group at BRIITE in Seattle

OVERVIEW

The next BRIITE will be held in Seattle, WA September 10th – 13th. The Voice & Data Operations department at the hosting institution, FHCRC, will be sponsoring Birds of a Feather (BoF) sessions focusing on topics of interest to data and voice networking colleagues at BRIITE institutions. We plan to use tours of the FHCRC environment as a jumping off point for discussion, comparing strategies for solving current problems.

BOFS

The Physical Layer

Tour sample IDFs, MDFs, meet-me rooms, and server rooms. Compare and contrast strategies for organizing and documenting copper and fiber cable plants, rack layouts, cooling, and power distribution.

Documenting the Network

Use the Voice/Data Operations department's "Map Wall" to compare and contrast strategies for documenting networks. Bring your own maps, pin them up on the wall; bring your own laptop, plug into the projector, and illustrate your points with documentation drawn from your own site.

Managing the Network

Bring your own laptop and tour the Web interfaces to the Voice/Data Operations department's fault management tools (NodeWatch, Swatch, Battery Capacity/Power Supply monitoring), trending tools (MRTG), and capacity planning tools (Porter Report, Pinger Report).

VoIP. Managing Internet bandwidth usage. Managing the plethora of holes in the firewall. Testing redundancy, disaster recovery, firedrills.
