Hermann J. Muller was born in New York City, on Dec. 21, 1890. He entered Columbia College in 1907, receiving the B.A. degree from that institution in 1910. In 1911 he received the degree of M.A. in the Faculty of Pure Science, Columbia University. During the year 1911-'12 he was Fellow in Physiology at the Cornell University Medical College, and from 1912 to 1915 he was Assistant in the Department of Zoology, at Columbia University. In 1915 he was appointed Instructor in Biology at the Rice Institute, Houston, Texas.
